

NuSTAR launch anniversary (2012)

NASA's *Nuclear Spectroscopic Telescope Array* was launched in 2012. It is the first mission aiming to study the X-ray sky at energies above 10 keV. The mission's aims are to research black holes and map supernova explosions. An X-ray telescope like *NuSTAR* affords us access to small bursts of X-ray emission from many objects such as the Sun or Jupiter. Before the *NuSTAR* mission, we did not know about the presence of X-ray flares on Jupiter, among many other ground-breaking discoveries. After more than 10 years, *NuSTAR* mission is still operating, making progress on the study and evolution of neutron stars and black holes that live in the centers of galaxies.
